Chapter 2: Operations

Section 1-201: Administrative Code: Scope, Adoption, Amendment, Repeal

- A. **Scope of Administrative Code.** This Code of Judicial Administration is adopted to implement the supreme court's Article 6, Section 3 administrative supervision of all of the courts in the state. Typically, an administrative code section affects multiple courts, addresses ongoing responsibilities, states authority and duties of judicial officers and employees in addition to the authority and duties stated in the rules of court, implements statutes, or makes significant legal or operational distinctions concerning court customers and persons regulated by the court other than persons regulated by court rules.
