Pursuant to Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution, the Supreme Court is responsible for appointing six judges to the Arizona Commission on Judicial Conduct. To facilitate the continuity of judicial experience on the commission, the article established a system of staggered terms for the judicial members of the commission. While this provision was successfully implemented originally, the Court is now advised that the terms of the two superior court judges on the commission expire simultaneously, as do the terms of the two court of appeals judges, and that a better system for overlapping and staggering terms could be achieved by allowing one term of each type of judge to expire in the same year. Therefore, after due consideration,

IT IS ORDERED that the Honorable Robert Brutinel, a judge of the Superior Court in Yavapai County, whose current term on the commission expires December 31, 2004, is reappointed to fill the unexpired term of the Honorable J. William Brammer, Jr., a judge of the Court of Appeals, Division 2, whose current term expires on December 31, 2008, and that the Honorable J. William Brammer, Jr., who has resigned from his current term, effective December 31, 2004, is reappointed to a new term beginning January 1, 2005, and ending December 31, 2010.
