ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
No. 2004- 54

Pursuant to Rule I(4) of the Uniform Rules of Practice of the Superior Court of Arizona, and Administrative Rule V-A (amended III(B)(4) of Administrative Order 96-32, the presiding judge in each county shall appoint with the approval of the Supreme Court an associate presiding judge to act during the absence or unavailability of the presiding judge.

On July 21, 2004, Honorable Colin F. Campbell, Presiding Judge, requested approval of the appointment of Judge Norman J. Davis and Judge Eddward J. Ballinger, Jr., as Associate Presiding Judge, during the absence of the presiding judge with Judge Norman J. Davis to serve commencing July 26, 2004 to August 1, 2004, and Judge Eddward J. Ballinger, Jr., to serve August 2, 2004 to August 8, 2004, and September 17, 2004 to September 26, 2004.

Now, therefore, in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform Rules of Practice and Administrative Rule V-A (amended) cited herein,

IT IS ORDERED that the Court approves the appointment of the Honorable Norman J. Davis as Associate Presiding Judge of the Superior Court and for the County of Maricopa, and in accordance with Rule I (7) (b) for a term commencing July 26, 2004 and expiring August 1, 2004. He shall serve at the pleasure of the presiding judge and exercise and discharge all powers and duties of the presiding judge, except that he may not appoint court commissioners or appoint judges permanently to special assignments.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Court approves the appointment of the Honorable Eddward J. Ballinger, Jr., as Associate Presiding Judge of the Superior Court and for the County of Maricopa, and in accordance with Rule I (7) (b) for a term commencing August 2, 2004 and expiring on August 8, 2004, and for a term commencing on September 17, 2004 and expiring on September 26, 2004. He shall serve at the pleasure of the presiding judge and exercise and discharge all powers and duties of the presiding judge, except that he may not appoint court commissioners or appoint judges permanently to special assignments.
