Arizona Revised Statutes, Title 32, Chapter 40, establishes temporary and standard certification for court reporters and specifies the Board of Certified Court Reporters (“Board”) shall recommend and the Supreme Court will adopt policies and procedures to implement and enforce these statutory provisions. Accordingly, the Court has adopted the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 7-206: Court Reporter Certification (Administrative Order No. 2004-58). Arizona Laws 2000, Chapter 41, § 13(B) and § 7-206(G)(5)(5)(a)(1) provides: “All temporary certificates shall be renewed annually and may not be renewed beyond December 31, 2002, except that the board may renew temporary certificates after December 31, 2002 due to extenuating circumstances.”

On April 9, 2003, by Administrative Order No. 2003-47, the Chief Justice adopted policies regarding the specific information the Board will require if a reporter requests a further extension of temporary certification. After further review, the Board recommends changes to these policies. These modifications are reflected in the attached policies and are incorporated as Appendix A.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Arizona Constitution and Arizona Revised Statutes, Title 32, Chapter 40,

IT IS ORDERED adopting the attached amended Policies on Requests for Extensions of Temporary Certification Based on Extenuating Circumstances.
