In the Matter of: ESTABLISHMENT OF THE TASK FORCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE ARIZONA LAW COURSE

Administrative Order No. 2009 - 19

Effective January 1, 2010, the Supreme Court amended Supreme Court Rule 38 allowing applicants who meet the requirements of a new subparagraph (h) to be admitted to the practice of law in Arizona on motion. Pursuant to subparagraph (h) 5: "Before being admitted on motion, the applicant must complete a course on Arizona law, the content and method of delivery of which shall be approved by the supreme court." The Court has deemed it advisable to constitute a Task Force to develop and recommend the content and method of delivery of this course.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3 of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the Task Force for the Development of the Arizona Law Course is established as follows:

- 1. PURPOSE: The Task Force shall:
 - a. Develop and recommend the content of the required course on Arizona law;
 - b. Identify and recommend the method and schedule of delivery of the required course on Arizona law; and
 - c. Recommend faculty to present the required course on Arizona law.
- 2. MEMBERSHIP: The membership of the Task Force is attached as Appendix A. The Chief Justice may appoint additional members as may be necessary.
- 3. MEETINGS: All meetings shall comply with the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration § 1-202: Public Meetings.
- 4. REPORTS: The Task Force shall submit a final recommendation report to the Supreme Court by August 31, 2009.
- 5. STAFF: The Administrative Office of the Courts shall provide staff for the Task Force who shall assist the Task Force in the development of the recommendations and submission of the final report. Staff shall also be responsible for the development and submission of the curriculum.
