



Courts.

To assist the court in developing and executing the educational system there is created the Council on Judicial Education and Training which shall:

- (1) advise this court on a continuing basis of the most effective and practical means for establishing judicial education programs for all judges and personnel of the judicial department of Arizona;
- (2) recommend to the court programs for orientation of all new judges appointed or elected to the bench;
- (3) outline a program of recommended mandatory continuing legal education for all judges and magistrates in Arizona;
- (4) recommend those educational programs given by national or regional organizations which are appropriate and suitable for attendance by judges or other judicial personnel;
- (5) recommend methods of encouraging the development of cooperative educational programs among the various counties and cities of the state to make the most effective use of professional resources;
- (6) approve and recommend such educational programs submitted by judicial, public and private agencies and educational institutions which appear to be appropriate and helpful for judges or judicial personnel; and
- (7) recommend methods of public financing of judicial

education and training.

The council is authorized to establish such advisory committees as it deems necessary to assist it in carrying out its responsibilities.

It is the policy of this court that all educational programs for judicial personnel offered or conducted by any court or agency of the judicial department be coordinated with the Administrative Director of the Courts and that the training or course material of such programs meet the standards established by the Council and approved by this court.

The Council shall be composed of an appellate court judge, a trial court judge, a judge of a court not of record, a faculty member of an Arizona law school, an active member of the State Bar of Arizona and two persons employed within the judicial department who are neither judges nor lawyers. The members of the Council shall be appointed for two year terms by the chief justice subject to the approval of the members of this court.

The chief justice shall designate one of the members of the Council to act as chairman. The chairman shall preside over the proceedings of the Council, appoint the members of the advisory committees created by the Council, and periodically make reports to this court on the activities of the Council.

The Administrative Director of the Courts shall provide administrative assistance to the Council and make available to it the services of the staff of the judicial education division. The administrative director shall also provide such financial assistance to the

Council as may be authorized within the court's budget.
