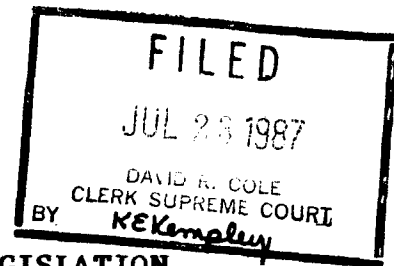


SUPREME COURT OF ARIZONA



COMMITTEE ON IMPLEMENTATION OF DRUG-RELATED LEGISLATION

Administrative Order No. 87-30

In accordance with recently enacted House Bill 2202 on drug crimes, the Arizona Supreme Court has been authorized to develop a plan on drug-testing for adults and juveniles charged with public offenses. Now, therefore, in order to implement this legislation,

IT IS ORDERED that an advisory Committee on the Implementation of Drug-Related Legislation is hereby created to review House Bill 2202, which becomes effective August 1, 1987, to advise the Council on Judicial Administration on the implementation of the new provisions, and to assist the Administrative Office of the Courts in assembling an application for additional resources that will be submitted to the Criminal Justice Commission this fall;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the following persons are appointed to the Committee on Implementation of Drug-Related Legislation beginning August 1, 1987, until completion.
