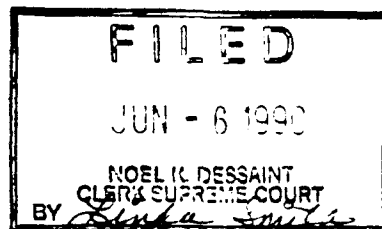

COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATION



Administrative Order No. 90-20

In accordance with Administrative Order No. 90-13, the Chief Justice may establish standing committees to the Arizona Judicial Council to assist the Council in carrying out its responsibilities. Now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED THAT a standing committee on legislation is hereby established as a committee of the Arizona Judicial Council and shall be known as the Committee on Legislation. This Committee is created to assist the Arizona Judicial Council and the Supreme Court in the proper development of legislation affecting the judicial department and the proper coordination of legislative programs throughout the judiciary.

1. Purposes. The Committee on Legislation shall advise the Arizona Judicial Council and the Supreme Court on all relevant matters pertaining to state and federal legislation affecting the operations and procedures of the judiciary in the State of Arizona.
2. Membership. Committee membership shall be appointed by the Chief Justice and shall include representatives of the Court of Appeals, the superior court, courts of limited jurisdiction, the State Bar of Arizona, and such other members as may be appointed at the discretion of the Chief Justice.
3. Terms of Members. Committee members shall be appointed for terms of varying lengths to encourage continuity on the Committee. Committee members may be re-appointed for successive terms.
4. Responsibilities of Members. Committee members shall actively participate in Committee meetings, the administration of Committee affairs, and advisory committees.
5. Organization. The Chief Justice shall appoint Committee leadership as needed to organize Committee affairs. Advisory committees to help the Committee carry out its responsibilities may be appointed by the chairperson with the approval of the Chief Justice.

6. Meetings. The Committee shall meet no less than twice a year and additional meetings may be called at the discretion of the Committee chairperson. All meetings shall be noticed and open to the public.

7. Actions. The Committee shall adopt rules for conducting Committee business. These rules shall prescribe the quorum and majority needed to constitute Committee actions.

8. Staff. Under the direction of the Chief Justice, the Administrative Office of the Courts shall provide staff for the Committee and may conduct or coordinate management and research studies of judicial administration as recommended by the Committee.
