ORDER DIRECTING DEVELOPMENT OF
STATISTICAL REPORTING STANDARDS FOR ARIZONA COURTS

Administrative Order No. 90-55

The Arizona Judicial Council has recommended that the Court adopt a court statistical reporting system based on the National Center for State Courts' statistical reporting standards. Now, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the Administrative Office of the Courts develop a plan for the adoption and implementation of such a system. The system and standards shall include reporting requirements for caseload, financial, and personnel information, and such other information as deemed necessary. The plan shall include:

- 1) the drafting of administrative orders as needed to implement such a system;
- 2) a timetable for finalization of data definitions, calculations, and reporting requirements for each level of court including limited jurisdiction courts, superior court (including juvenile and adult probation departments, and clerks of court), and appellate courts.

The Arizona Judicial Council, through its Committee on Technology, shall oversee the process. Other committees shall be involved as needed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all segments of the judicial department cooperate and assist as needed in the development and implementation of this plan.
